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## President's Message

2023 was packed with exciting developments as the BCRMTA continued to provide programs and supports for its members.

Things started off in January / February with the 2023 Vocal Competition to select the BCRMTA representative for the CFMTA Vocal Competition. Due to time constraints and geographical logistics, the AdHoc Committee - Barbara Siemens, Leah Field, Laurie Hirshman, Elisa Rolston, Matthew Chan - arranged for recorded submissions to be adjudicated by renowned vocalist Richard Epp. There were three participants:

with Paige advancing to the next level. On the piano side, the Young Artist Tour featuring BC Piano Competition Winner Edward Duan kicked off in January and continue through April. Edward delighted audiences in:

- Coquitlam/Maple Ridge
- Mid-Island, North Island
- South Fraser
- Vancouver/Burnaby

as he prepared to compete at the National level along with Paige.

Activities continued throughout the Spring. In April, the Council meeting had several highlights. The Delegates approved a motion to add the position of member-at-large to the Executive. Another motion saw the adoption of "Professional Pedagogy" to the list of specialist disciplines. The Heritage Fund was renewed for a ten-year term with an increase in support from \$200 to \$300 per Branch. It was also decided to send an Online Survey to members to gather opinions on two initiatives: a monthly online social and a student composers' club, more on these two activities later in the article.

There were some changes on the Provincial Executive. We bid adieu to Secretary Anita Perry and had the pleasure of presenting her with a lovely clock and pen stand in appreciation for her many years of service. Susan Chan was introduced as Anita's replacement, and she soon proved herself to be very capable in the role. Jammy Smith stepped back as 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President and Sue Wood was elected 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President while I stepped into the position of President and Mimi Ho moved up to Past President. Registrar Joyce Janzen and Treasurer Matthew Chan remained stead fast as always and their expertise continues to be appreciated. For full details of the Council proceedings, check the minutes and committee reports available in the Members Only section at bcrmta.bc.ca.

In early July, 1st Vice President Sue Wood and I attended the CFMTA annual meeting in Edmonton. It was an intense two days, but the atmosphere was collegial and the discussions interesting. A few highlights included: a reworking of the Essay Competition which promotes pedagogical research at the post secondary and post Graduate level, exploration of a multidisciplinary national competition, and the presentation of the Strategic Planning committee's Survey Results. There were other pertinent topics covered in the meetings, all of which can be found in the minutes and committee reports at cfmta.org in the Members Only section.

The CFMTA meetings were immediately followed by the National Conference which included the National Piano and Vocal Competitions. The Conference sessions were engaging with a wide variety of presenters, and the Competition presented musicians from coast to coast to coast. Pianist Edward Duan and Vocalist Paige Kapps represented BCRMTA with the former coming in 1st place after a stunning performance in the Final Round. At the luncheon on the last day, our own Joanne Lougheed was presented with the Hugheen Ferguson Distinguished Teacher Award in honour of her contribution to the BCRMTA. Joanne was unable to attend but she later sent a note expressing her gratitude.

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### President's Message - cont.

After a well-earned summer break, teachers were back in full force in September. At this point, the Executive took the initiative to create short videos to be posted on YouTube and circulated via email. The first video introduced the members of the Executive and the following clips in October and December made announcements and reminded teachers of various deadlines.

In the third week of September, the Provincial Council held its semi-annual meeting. Once again, there were many interesting developments. An Advertising and Publicity Ad Hoc Committee was instigated to create a blueprint for both the Provincial and Branch levels, a report will be presented to the April Council. The Committee started monthly meetings in November with Jeanette Dyck, Katherine Hume, Pauline Ng, Lillian Chan, Laura Webster, and Barbara Siemens. The formation of a Website Grant Ad Hoc Committee was another directive from the September Council, although ultimately there was not enough support to get the project started. Regarding the Student Composers' Competition, as recommended by the Chair Susan Evens the Council agreed to a restructuring of the fees and awards. And finally, it was reported that three of six CFMTA motions on a multidisciplinary national competition were defeated. As the margins of defeat were very narrow (tied or 1 vote), the CFMTA Task Force was asked to examine the results and put forward a report for the National meeting in July 2024. The Fall was a busy time with two new initiatives for members and their students. Under the direction of Past President Mimi Ho and her committee, the Online Social Event started planning for three meetings to be held in 2024. The gatherings are intended to help BCRMTA teachers connect, exchange ideas, and support one another. In October, the Student Composers' Club had its inaugural meeting with coordinators Katya Pine and Kathleen Feenstra plus over twenty students. The Club is still in the formative stages and changes in the format will likely occur as they settle into a groove, but it had an auspicious beginning.

Other projects continued as usual throughout the year. In April, the BCRMTA acknowledged the 25 Year Pin Recipients, the Community Service Award winners, and the Pedagogy Award Winner, these individuals are noted on pages 7 - 9. Also listed are the BC Student Composer Competition winners at both the Provincial and National Levels on pages 14 - 18.. November's focal point was Canada Music Week and many Branches across the Province participated in events as you can read in the reports section of the magazine. The Branch Presidents' Round Table met in February, May, and October to discuss common challenges, and the Abbotsford Conference Committee provided progress reports for the upcoming ABC – Back to Basics event in September 2024.

All in all, 2023 was a productive year and we can all look forward to an equally scintillating 2024!

# BCRMTA Pedagogy Award Kelly Chang Shu

Every year BCRMTA gives a Pedagogy Award to the student in each of three conservatories:

- BC Conservatory of Music
- Conservatory Canada
- Royal Conservatory of Music

who achieves the highest aggregate mark in the Associate Teachers' Diploma. The award consists of a \$125 scholarship and a one year free membership in BCRMTA.

This year the Royal Conservatory of Music was the only conservatory who responded. Our Pedagogy Award Winner is Kelly Chang Shu, from Richmond.



### **Kelly Chang Shu**

Coming from a family of musicians on my mother's side, I began music lessons at the age of 3 with my first instrument, the accordion. A few years later, and after moving halfway across the world, I took up the piano. After scoring highly on exams and consistently placing in the top 3 in local festivals, I eventually earned my ARCT Performer's. That was when my teaching journey began.

Despite a few different trajectories, I decided to take in my post-secondary studies and career, teaching was always something I pursued and loved. This passion only grew as I matured and gained more teaching and life experiences. The joy of inspiring in my students a love for music and being a part of my students' learning and growth is one of the most rewarding things to me. At the same time, I also earned my second ARCT in Piano Pedagogy as a way to further my own musical education, along with certificates in teaching Elementary, Intermediate, and Advanced Piano. I'm currently pursuing the Licentiate diploma in Piano Performance, as I believe a good teacher must never stop pushing herself.

And now, more than 2 decades after first starting to teach, I run my own studio with 40-50 students, and I can honestly say, I enjoy every minute of it. I can't wait to see where the path leads for this next generation of musicians.

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# Young Artist Tour



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# BCRMTA Student Composer Competition

### 2023 Adjudicator - Nicholas Kelly

Commended by the Vancouver Sun for his "sophisticated work of such immediate, glittery appeal" and called "a rising star in the constellation of Canadian composers" by Oregon Arts Watch, Nicholas Ryan Kelly writes choral, wind ensemble, and chamber music infused with a sense of cinematic drama.

His choral compositions have been performed and released on CD by many of Canada's top choirs, including Chor Leoni, Da Capo Chamber Choir, Elektra Women's Choir, Pro Coro Canada, Vancouver Chamber Choir, and the National Youth Choir of Canada.

International performances include the Singapore Youth Choir, the Capital Hearings (Washington, DC), the West Point Band of the US Army, and many others. Since 2015, he has received over 20 national and international composition prizes, including the Howard Cable Prize from the Canadian Band Association and the Edwin Fissinger Choral Composition Prize.

Originally from the northeastern USA, Nick studied composition at Ithaca College in New York (B.M.) and the University of British Columbia in Vancouver (M.Mus.) He lives in British Columbia's beautiful Okanagan Valley. His choral scores are published with Pavane Publishing, Cypress Choral Music, Renforth Music, and Alliance Music. He also self-publishes through Lone Moose Music, distributed by MusicSpoke.


**Houtian Zhong**

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# BCRMTA Representative - Edwad Duan CFMTA/FCAPM Piano Competition



Edward Duan was born in Vancouver and began studying the piano at the age of four. He has won many top prizes in local competitions. He was the recipient of the Provincial Gold Medal for the highest mark in the province for both his Grade 8 and Grade 9 Royal Conservatory of Music Piano Exams. Last year, Edward completed his ARCT Diploma Exam and again was awarded the Gold Medal for the highest mark in the province.

Edward has appeared as soloist with the Vancouver Academy of Music Orchestra in the Orpheum Theatre as winner of their concerto competition. As First Place Winner in the Crescendo International Music Competition, he performed in Carnegie Hall's newest venue, Zankel Hall, in New York City in March 2022. Also last July Edward, was accepted into the Oxbridge Academic Programs which enabled him to spend the summer studing engineering and astronomy at Oxford University in England.

#### A note about Jarred Dunn:

He continued his studies with Maria João-Pires, Andrei Gavrilov, Andrzej Jasiński, Robert Levin, Dorothy Taubman, and David Dubal.

Jarred Dunn won first prize and concerto award at the 7<sup>th</sup> Lithuanian International Chopin Competition (Vilnius) and was a finalist and prizewinner at the 1<sup>st</sup> Jan Hoffman International Competition (Kraków), among others. He has been heard on CBC/Radio-Canada, New Classical 96.3FM, WWFM, WQXR New York, and Belarusian First Radio. His recordings include Chopin and Debussy and Brahms in Solitude; in 2023 he will record the complete Chopin Mazurkas. He regularly serves as a juror for competitions, recently the Lithuanian International Chopin, Classicalia International, Global Musical Arts (Jury Co-Chair), and CFMTA National Piano Competitions. In 2022, he hosted Competition Studio TV at the 12<sup>th</sup> International Paderewski Piano Competition.

Summary of Dr. Kendall Hafermehl workshop "The Pianist and Their Piano"

Presenter - Dr. Kendall Hafermehl, RPT

### Sunday, February 26th, 2023, at the Cranbrook First Baptist Church

An eager audience of seventeen, including piano teachers, advanced level piano students, parents and music enthusiasts enjoyed a very interesting and informative two-hour workshop with Dr. Kendall Hafermehl, RPT. Kendall explained that creating beautiful music starts with our instrument and that our understanding of how it works is an integral part of our artistic vision.

Kendall treated the workshop participants to view and examine various physical models of piano actions he had brought including a full-scale model of the inner rim of a 4'8" grand piano. He explained how friction, key feedback, freedom, and inspiration all harmonize to create the beautiful music we as artists desire.

Kendall gave a short lesson on how the pedals work on different pianos, including upright and grands that gave insight as to what is happening when you depress the key and the pedal. In addition to the physical models, a demonstration using the church grand piano, an informative power point presentation, and an explanation of the tools used by professional piano technicians greatly assisted in the understanding of the concepts presented.

Simple ways to help your piano be the best it can be and how to keep it maintained were highlighted. Kendall concluded the workshop with a question-and-answer session and participants left feeling the workshop inspired about their instruments and music.

We were fortunate to have a biography of Joan written by Joan, memories of Joan written by Susan de Burgh, read by Jennifer Rebner, memories of Joan written by Sylvia Rickard, read by Pam Smirl, and memories of Joan by Judith Pazder, along with the "High Notes Flute Choir" performing music by Joan.

When the adjudicator came to comment on the student playing Joan's piece, she said vaguely, "I think Joan Hansen lives around here somewhere. "Joan was in the back of the Hall waving and saying, "I'm here!" The adjudicator ignored her and proceeded to tell the student the opposite of what Joan wanted in the performance of her piece. Joan laughed heartily at the

memory of the adjudicator's interpretation of her music."

Sylvia Rickard had many humourous memories from many events shared with Joan. She summed up our feeling with "Her piano playing was beautiful, sometimes with a sort of 6th sense of fragility, vulnerability even. She really felt the pains and joys of young people through their music. I miss Joanie very much, and say to her "Bravissima, Joanie Dear".

Judith Pazder was able to share with us regarding Joan's "Herbal Remedies" which has four movements; Basil with a Latin feel, Terragon presenting as exotic, Rosemary sounds like Bach to modern, and Sage has a warm lush sound. (see photo)





- In a very special presentation, Christopher Norton joined us in person, presenting his featured works from the new RCM syllabus.










### Richmond - cont.



- String Chamber Music Program: it was our 2<sup>nd</sup> year in launching this program for our string students. A big shout out to our member, Margitta Krebs, for dedicating her time to coaching and guiding these young students.

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

She continued her studies with French Pianist and Pedagogue Yvonne Hubert at L'Ecole de Musique Vincent d'Indy, Université de Montréal. There, she received both the Bachelor of Music and the Master of Music degrees in performance "avec très grande distinction." She received prestigious awards, including the Cécile Léger Scholarship Award of the Ladies' Morning Musical Club of Montreal, First Prize in the Concerto Class resulting in a televised performance with the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC) Orchestra conducted by Wilfred Pelletier, and the Best Chamber Musician Award at the Québec Provincial Music Competition.

After completing her studies in Montreal, Diana pursued postgraduate studies in Munich, Germany, and Salzburg, Austria, with renowned pianist Friedrich Wührer. She further refined her artistic abilities under the guidance of Ivan Moravec and Hans Keller during study periods in Prague and London.

Returning to Canada, Diana joined the faculties of the Maritime Conservatory of Music in Halifax and the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto. She taught piano interpretation and technique, performed solo recitals, and engaged in chamber music performances. Diana's passion for music extended beyond teaching and performing; she traveled across Canada as an examiner for the Royal Conservatory Examination System.

Later, Diana became a faculty member of the Department of Music at the University of Ottawa. Alongside her university teaching, she maintained a significant class of private students, many of whom went on to establish careers as professional musicians. She performed as a soloist and collaborated with leading musicians from the National Arts Center.

In 1992, Diana relocated to Victoria, British Columbia, where she taught piano and piano accompaniment at the School of Music, University of Victoria, until 2004. During this time, she continued to give masterclasses, performed as a soloist and chamber musician in Canada, Germany, and Italy, and served as an adjudicator at various music festivals and competitions in British Columbia.

From 2009 to 2012, Diana lived in Singapore, where she lectured and served as a jury member at the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts. She also played an active role in the Executive Committee of the Chopin Society Singapore, responsible for international liaison.

Diana's teaching philosophy aimed at transcending the physical requirements of the piano to achieve pure musical expression. Her love for music, her captivating artistry and musicianship, infectious laughter, elegance, and grace touched the hearts of friends, students, and colleagues around the world. She will be deeply missed by all who knew and loved her.

The family expresses their gratitude to the staff of the Royal Jubilee Hospital and the Victoria Hospice Team for providing exceptional care during Diana's final weeks. Special thanks go to Drs. Inman, McArdle, Minaker, Dewart, and Malik for their outstanding support.

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# Members we have lost this year Janet Marilyn Leffek

January 9, 1934 - January 10, 2023

Janet died peacefully on the 10th January after a battle with dementia in the Broadmead Memorial Lodge Care Home. She is survived by her loving husband, Ken, of 64 years, her daughter Katharine (David), her son Geoffrey (Clare), 13 grandchildren, and 4 great- grandchildren. Janet was born in Tamworth, Ontario to Helen and James Wallace where she spent her early years before the family moved to New Brunswick, first to Sussex, then to Moncton. She studied piano with Ernest Freeborn, and accompanied choirs and the school orchestra at Moncton High School. She went on to Mount Allison University where she obtained a B.Sc. in home economics (cum laude), in 1955, and also studied piano there with Evron Kinsman, and accompanied many singers.

In 1956 Janet travelled to England, where she studied with Robin Wood at the Royal Academy of Music, and in 1957 was awarded the LRAM diploma. She sang for two years with the Royal Choral Society in London, whose members performed regularly in the Royal Albert Hall with the London Symphony under Sir Malcolm Sargent and others.

In 1958 Janet married Ken Leffek in London with the ceremony performed by Lord Donald Soper. They returned to Canada and settled in Halifax, Nova Scotia in 1961. In 1968 Janet met Yvonne Enoch, who introduced her to the group teaching of piano, in classes of eight students with four pianos. She was hired by the Halifax School System in 1971 to teach piano by this method. The programme grew over twelve years until over 200 children and three part-time teachers were involved. It reached its high point in 1980 when 32 of her students playing 16 pianos in the Halifax Metro Centre performed an arrangement of "The Carnival of the Animals" by Saint Saens. This remains to this day a unique performance in the annals of classical music. Sometime later the programme was terminated by the School Board on the grounds that it was elitist. All told Janet taught piano in Halifax for over 30 years and played an active part in the Nova Scotia Registered Music Teachers' Association of which she was made a life member. For nine years she was also the rehearsal accompanist for the Atlantic Symphony Orchestra Choir. Janet has given lectures and workshops on piano group teaching in Nova Scotia and England and taught the piano pedagogy course at Acadia University for one year as a sabbatical replacement. She has adjudicated at over two dozen music Festivals in the four Atlantic provinces and British Columbia. Janet's last performances were recitals at Care Homes in Victoria, including a number at the Broadmead Memorial Lodge, where she spent the last two years of her life after she developed dementia.
